VILLAGE OF BENNET BOARD OF TRUSTEES MINUTES JANUARY 9, 2012

The Bennet Board of Trustees (the "Board") of the Village of Bennet, Nebraska (the "Village") held their regular monthly session on Monday, January 9th, 2012 at 8:00 p.m., at the regular meeting place of the Board, the Village Hall, 685 Monroe Street in the Village, the same being open to the public and preceded by advance publicized notice duly given in strict compliance with the provisions of the Open Meetings Act. All motions (*) contained herein were duly made and approved, unless specifically noted, by roll call vote. Ordinances approved on final reading are posted or published in pamphlet form and available upon request at the Village office.

Chairman Justin Apel called the session to order at 8:00 p.m. and announced the location of the Open Meetings Act posted near the entrance of the room for access by the public. Village Clerk Patricia Rule conducted roll call and recorded the minutes. Trustees responding to roll call were Clark Jensen, Wendell Stone, John Widick, Brett Young and Justin Apel. A quorum being present and the meeting duly commenced, the following proceedings were taken while the meeting remained open to attendance by the public.

- Motion to accept the minutes for the regular December 12th, 2011 meeting.
- Motion to approve the minutes for the special session held on December 12th, 2011.

Communications were acknowledged. Unfinished business included discussion of a new draft ordinance regarding basic housing standards. Young suggested that the current building code would cover housing standards. Apel suggested the draft ordinance be amended to remove references to electricity.

- Motion to strike lines 4 through 6 of page five of the draft ordinance in preparation of adoption. Roll call vote; Stone, 4 YES, 1 NO. Motion carried.

Engineer Rich Robinson reviewed the services offered in a letter agreement for an evaluation of Bennet's sanitary sewer system. It was understood the engineers would be looking at existing data and providing a recommendation on how to proceed.

- Motion to move forward with the study and identify problem areas with the agreement. Roll call vote; 3 YES, 2 NO. Motion carried.

A request for reconsideration of permitting the use of golf carts on public streets was withdrawn.

Village Attorney William Austin provided information on the status of ownership and survivability of liens the Village holds on Lot 3 and the south 1/2 of Lot 2, Block 33 in Bennet. Austin agreed to draft a letter to the company that purchased the tax certificates on the property to inform them of the Village's interest.

Resolution 2012-1.1 was introduced appointing Kenneth Maahs as Utility Superintendent and establishing his salary.

- Motion to approve Resolution 2012-1.1.

New business discussed were changes or additions to the One & Six Year Street Plan and a snow emergency plan. A review of the Village Insurance Policy was delayed due to lack of a current invoice to compare with prior cost and coverage.

Resolution 2012-1.2 was introduced authorizing the letting of contracts for snow removal by the Village Clerk/Treasurer in the event of a snow emergency.

- Motion to approve Resolution 2012-1.2 as amended.
- Motion to adjourn at 10:37 p.m.

STERLING PUBLIC SCHOOLS MINUTES OF MEETING

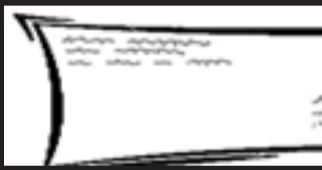
